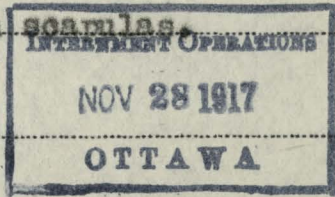

2. That I will observe the laws of the country, abstain from espionage or any acts or correspondence of a hostile nature or intended to give information to or assist the enemies of the British Empire:
3. That I will agree to work for six months at current rate of wages for the Canadian Government Railways.
4. That I will report as directed by the nearest Police Officer to the point at which I am required to work.
